Northeast Water Purification Plant Expansion :

The Early Work Package (EWP) 1 Site Development Certificate of Completion has been issued. All punch list items are scheduled to be completed by August. Additionally, the EWP 4 Raw Water Pipelines access roads are nearing final grade. Construction for EWP 4 is approximately 90% complete.



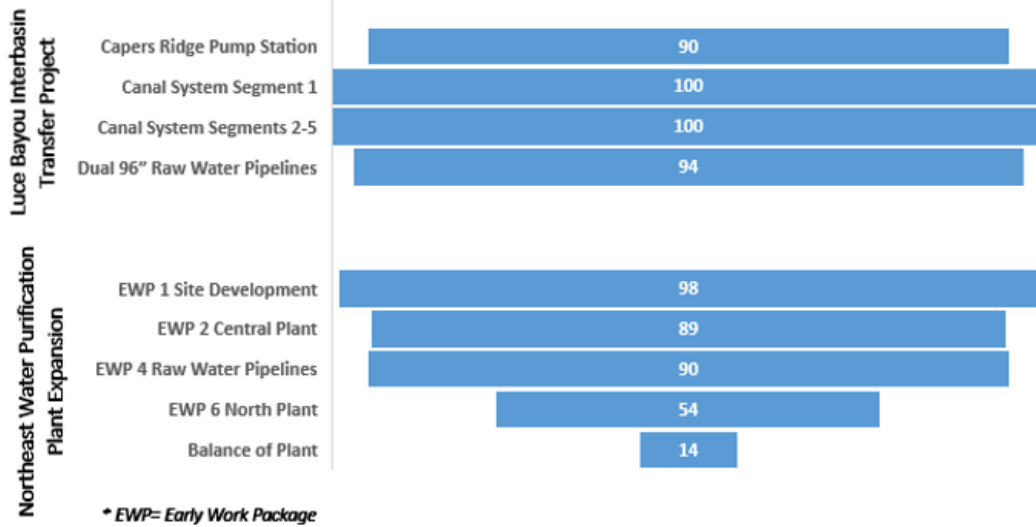

Luce Bayou Interbasin Transfer Project:

The Capers Ridge Pump Station construction is at 90% completion and all Canal System segments are complete! The Dual 96" Raw Water Pipelines construction is at 94% completion.

Construction Updates (% Complete)



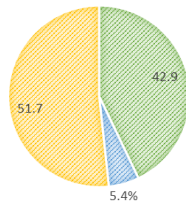
Surface Water Supply Project:

- As of July 31st, 77% of the easements for the project have been acquired.
- Central Pump Station 100% design plans are currently under review by the City of Houston and Texas Commission of Environmental Quality.
- The Segment C Bid Date has been pushed out to August 6th.

■ Surface Water ■ Reclaimed Water ■ Groundwater



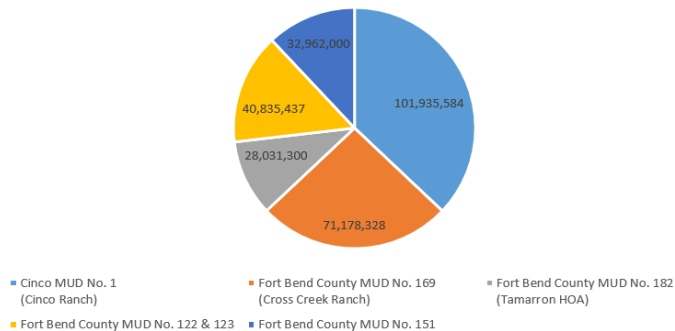
