#### **Luce Bayou Interbasin Transfer Project:**

Construction of the Capers Ridge Pump Station is approximately 92% complete. The four 2200 horsepower booster pumps were installed in August and initial testing is slated for early 2021.



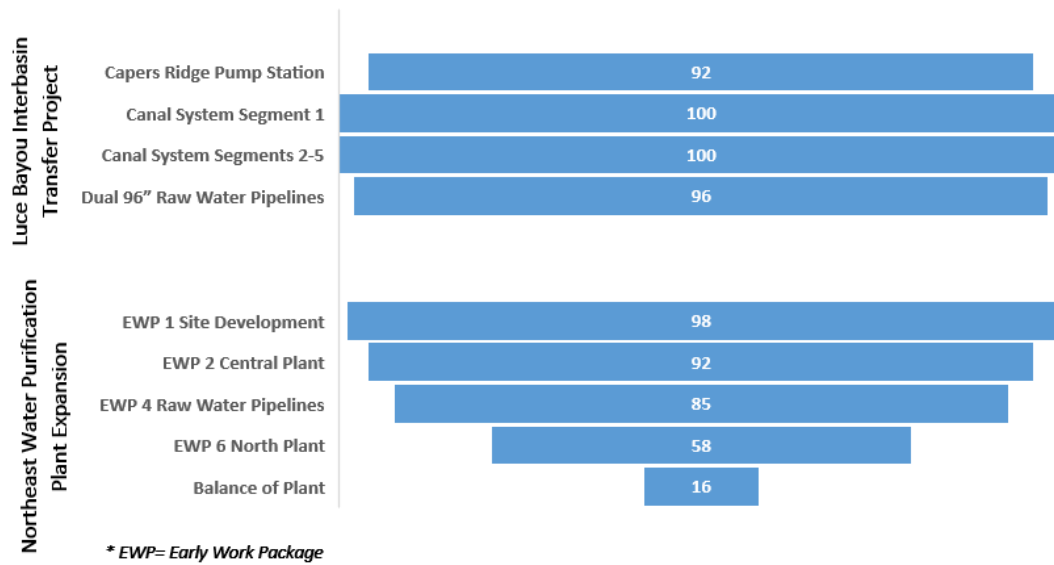
**One of Four Booster Pumps**

#### **Northeast Water Purification Plant Expansion:**

The Early Work Package (EWP) 6 Influent Pump Station Substation is over 58% complete. The bridge piping and pump cans have been installed.

## Construction Updates (% Complete)



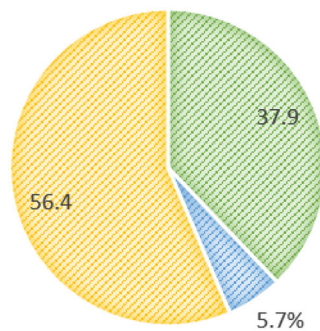
## Surface Water Supply Project:

- Segments C1 and C2 bids have been awarded and the total for both projects is \$94,924,225.87.

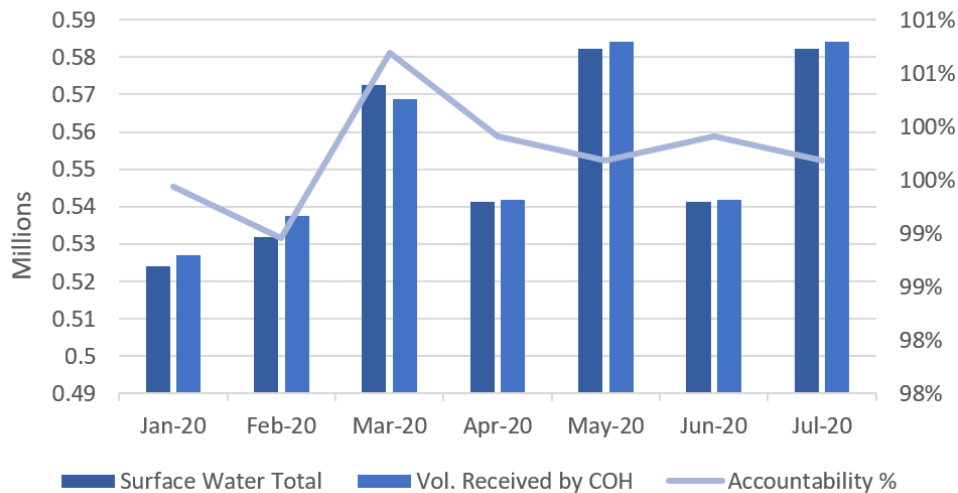
## NFBWA Water Usage
